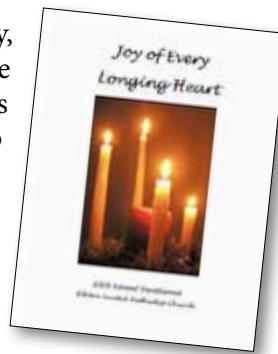

## Growth Task Force update

A condition of the Town Planning Commission's preliminary approval of our addition plan was that we reach an agreement with our neighbors on the site and building design to accommodate their needs to access the rear of their properties. We met and worked out some changes to the site that will meet their needs but will have some affect on the design.

The building will be moved five feet closer to High Street to allow for a five foot landscaped buffer on the back of the addition and a paved driveway. This will also add five feet to the interior of the addition where it connects to the existing building and will affect the parking lot plan.

Anticipating construction beginning in the spring of 2010, we are investigating financing to accommodate construction cash flow. Numbers indicate the pledged amount still falls short of the total amount required.

In addition, while others worked on the roof, Bill and Ted installed windows and doors in a new house that is being built to replace one that was destroyed by Hurricane Katrina.

The team was blessed to be able to assist in the ongoing disaster relief effort. We know that the congregation of Elkton UMC lifted us in prayer throughout the week. Those prayers gave us the strength to perform each of our assigned tasks.
